Michael Grimaldi Lecture Demo Structural Principles of Portraiture Feb 1-2, 2012. Time: 6:30-9:30pm

Structural Principles of Portraiture will be a two-evening lecture series demonstrating the use of anatomical, morphological and perspectival principles towards the construction of resolved portrait drawings from life.

The intelligent and selective use of anatomy, morphology and fundamental principles of perspective are essential to the effective translation of the human form to the picture plane. Through the separation and identification of primary perceptual and conceptual elements facing the artist when drawing the portrait from life (including gesture, proportions, perspective, likeness, facial expression, movement, and the effects of value on the major forms), participants will become familiarized with effective, applicable strategies towards the use of structural anatomy in drawing the human head from direct observation.

Michael Grimaldi studied painting and drawing at the Art Students League of New York, the National Academy, the New York Studio School, the Ecole Albert Defois and performed independent studies in gross anatomy and dissection at the Facultad Medicina de la Universidad de Buenos Aires. He currently teaches life drawing and anatomy at the Art Students League of New York, the Pennsylvania Academy of the Fine Arts, the Janus Collaborative School of Art (which he co-founded in 2007), and designed and teaches the Janus Collaborative's cadaver anatomy program hosted by Drexel University College of Medicine.
