Figure Drawing & Painting

Taught by Instructor Carl Dobsky

This program offers unparalleled opportunity for students to have the instructors teaching every day. This program will educate you in the techniques of the old masters. You will learn, anatomy structure, drawing painting, color. Sessions will include lecture demos, focused individual time with the instructors. In addition you will have the opportunity to work from museum master copies and sculptures. Most importantly you will enjoy the collaboration and the community of like-minded artists. This program is open for teens to build an impressive portfolio.

Drawing is the foundation of all successful representational life painting.

Clothed Figure:

Learning how to approach the clothed or draped figure is of extreme importance to a representational artist. Most figure work will inevitably be of a clothed or semi-clothed nature. The challenges presented by this can be a bit overwhelming at times. Everything from the impossibility of getting the models clothes back in the same arrangement every time after they have taken a break to understanding how cloth compresses and unfolds. In this course we will be examining ways to approach these complex situations.

Two drawings and one painting will be produced over the duration of one month. The two drawings will be used as studies which will be transferred to a support for the final painting.

The first drawing will work out the shape and proportion of the model using a fairly standard block-in method. Discussions on shape, anatomy, and gesture will help provide information that will help the student bring structural clarity to the work. The drawing will then be transferred to the canvas and the figure will be represented in oil paint. At this stage emphasis will be placed on the mixing of color to represent flesh as well as in depth discussion on how light interacts with the forms of the body.

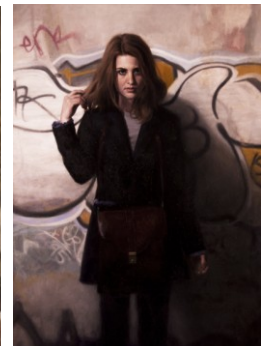
The focus of the second drawing will be of the drapery. The clothing will be arranged on a lay figure in order to allow it be observed in isolation and without movement inherent in the live model. We will examine the different ways cloth can fold and compress upon itself in an almost anatomical fashion to help provide a conceptual basis of what is occurring. This drawing will then be transferred to the same canvas and the painting completed.

5. The front row is reserved for students who prefer to sit down. Those students who wish to stand at their easels will have the space behind the seated students.
6. We will have the assigned chairs and easels set up before you get to class each morning.
7. Seating will be assigned by raffle.
8. Please refrain from talking while class is in session.
9. If you arrive late please enter quietly. If you have equipment to set up please wait for a break to set up so that you do not disrupt the class.
