Drawing & Painting

Taught by Instructors Michael Grimaldi & Juliette Aristides

Learn from Five Masters in a 4-month program. This program will educate you in the techniques of the old masters. You will learn, anatomy structure, drawing painting, color. Sessions will include lecture demos, focused individual time with the instructors. In addition you will have the opportunity to work from museum master copies and sculptures. Most importantly you will collaborate with other like-minded artists to grow your artistry.

Michael Grimaldi:

While striving for a naturalistic representation of the visual field, an intelligent and selective application of anatomy and perspective is an essential tool in the expression of the human figure.

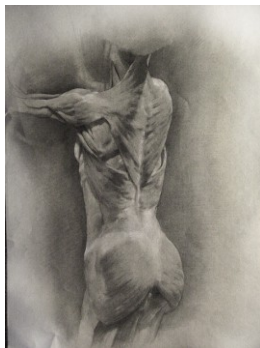
Balancing the perceptual and conceptual elements of drawing the human figure from life, students will be familiarized with strategies in the application of the knowledge the skeletal structure, musculature and morphology, and the effects of perspective and gesture on the form and function of the major forms of the human figure. Comparing and organizing the major anatomical landmarks and dynamics of the human figure. A thorough understanding of the visual experience, the ability to apply one's 3-dimensional experience to a 2-dimensional surface, and curiosity into the psychology of the sitter is essential for anyone wishing to translate these elements to the picture plane. Separating these elements, thoroughly studying them independently, and re-constructing them, combining other elements to create a well unified drawing will foster the student's ability to perceive the visual experience with intelligence, apply this knowledge to their work, and cultivate an ability to problem solve and auto-correct through the process of building the drawing in graphite or charcoal. Working two-week pose, students will explore the elements of proportion, gesture, perspective, likeness, movement, constructive anatomy and morphology, light on form, value construction and composition through sustained investigations of the human figure.

Juliette Aristides:

Instruction will be in the form of intensive, daily demonstrations and individual critique. 10 day Daily figure drawing from life and art drawing morning sessions working from the Rodin Sculpture Garden collection at Stanford Cantor Museum, will add a new dynamic to the program sculpture garden, the museum and outside- in the mornings. In the afternoon we can do limited palette -color sketches from the life model in the studio in the afternoons. In the afternoon working from master copies and the model Painting quick gestures and quick poster studies will help beginning artists get experience and more confidence. Fridays we would work in the museum from their drawing collection.



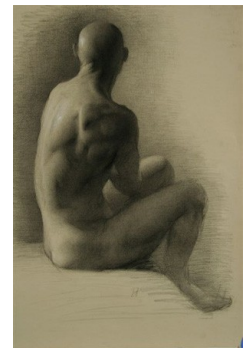
